#### **Sunrise Presents STARS Radiothon**

The Westman Critical Care on the Air radiothon was broadcast 'live' from the Keystone Centre parking lot on June 2. Sunrise Credit Union was the presenting sponsor for the 12-hour event, which raised funds for the air ambulance service.

STARS is a charitable, non-profit organization funded by generous individuals, organizations, businesses, event partners, and the government. Thanks to Sunrise's support, and other allies, STARS can respond 24/7 to care for critically ill and injured patients when and where needed most with their state-of-the-art medical helicopter and highly-skilled crew members.

This year's radiothon slightly changed, moving to QCountry and STAR-FM. 2023 also marked Sunrise's fourth year as the presenting sponsor for the STARS radiothon.

Donations exceeded the organization's original goal, with more than \$53,000 raised during the radiothon.

## **Baker Claims 2023 Our Manitoba Photo Contest**

A panel of Sunrise staff selected Baker's photo 'Sunflower Sunset' as one of the 30



finalists from approximately 250 entries for this year's contest. Sunrise held a week-long public vote on the 30 finalists in April through the <u>ourmanitoba.org</u> website, with Baker's photo earning the most nods to be declared the winner.

Baker captured the winning photo south of Neepawa in mid-August 2022 and entered the Our Manitoba Photo Contest for the first time in 2023 after hearing about the contest on social media and being encouraged to join by family and friends.

All 13 finalists will receive a canvas print of the winning photograph and be featured in the 2024 Sunrise Credit Union calendar. In addition, Baker earned the Grand Prize of a \$500 One-Year Term Deposit from Sunrise Credit Union.

### **Manitoba Curling Legends Honoured**

Some local legends in the sport of curling were honoured at the Manitoba Curling Hall of Fame & Museum induction ceremony in Brandon on May 7.

Sunrise Credit Union was the presenting sponsor for the event at the Victoria Inn, with five teams, two builders, and two curlers recognized for a career of excellence. The teams include the 2011 Canadian Senior Champion & 2012 World Silver Medal-

The individual inductees were builders Dave Petursson and Bob Flock. Petursson officiated many Provincial, National, and International events, while Flock was a police curling leader and competitor. Curlers Ruth Wiebe and Doug Harrison were recognized for their long careers of competitive excellence.

It was the first time the Manitoba Curling Hall of Fame dinner was held in Brandon since 1995.
