Building Communities Grant Program



The spring intake of the Building Communities Grant Program took place in May. Close to 60

applications to assist organizations and projects in the Sunrise Credit Union trading area were received. After careful consideration, an evaluation committee identified four organizations to receive a combined \$50,000 in grant funding.

The Leda Lake Park project in Erickson will receive \$25,000. In recognition of the donation, the lookout structure will be named after Sunrise Credit Union in perpetuity. The project addresses the community's need for more parks and recreational space.

The grant program has funded a diverse range of projects. Prairie Skills Inc. in Deloraine will receive \$10,000 to assist with upgrades to emergency accessibility to the third floor. The Oak Lake Care Centre will receive \$10,000 to purchase furniture, toys, and equipment for the new 84-space daycare. The Swan Lake First Nation Pow Wow Committee will receive \$5,000 to increase accessibility to the grounds for the Elders and to the Elders' stand area. This variety of projects reflects the program's commitment to inclusivity and community development.



The fall intake period for the Building Communities Grant Program will take place from October 1-31, 2024.

Sunrise Scholarship Program

This spring, Sunrise Credit Union's revamped Scholarship Program made a significant impact, awarding 14 scholarships totaling \$24,000 to students. The program drew 60 applicants, with a six-person committee scoring each application on academics, leadership, extracurricular activities, volunteerism, community involvement, and essay quality.



St. Alphonse's Laura Delichte received the most significant scholarship: \$5,000 for a high-school graduate seeking post-secondary education.



Abbigail Conrad of Swan Lake received the \$3,000 scholarship awarded to a Sunrise Credit Union Summer Student; Elizabeth Greig of Melita received the \$3,000 scholarship for a first-year student continuing their education at Brandon University, and Lindsay Wytinck of Glenboro received the \$3,000 scholarship for a firstyear student continuing their education at Assiniboine Community College. Abbi, Elizabeth and Lindsay are all employed by Sunrise Credit Union as summer students, as is the \$1,000 scholarship winner Ainsley Boulanger of Hartney.

Manitoba Envirothon Appreciates Sunrise Credit Union

Sunrise Credit Union sponsored Manitoba Envirothon in 2024. The Manitoba Envirothon is an annual hands-on environmental education competition for high school students. It is designed to encourage teamwork, problem-solving skills, and public speaking while fostering an appreciation for current environmental issues.

Envirothon combines the exhilaration of team competition, the challenge of learning about environmental issues, and the experience of using this knowledge in handsactivities. This approach on to environmental education helps students develop skills necessary to address environmental problems, such as collaboration, critical thinking, and public debate.

Five regional events were held across Manitoba in April, and the top teams advanced to the Provincial Event at the International Peace Garden on May 23-25. The winning team at the Provincial Event receives a cash prize and a spot in the National Competition!

Environmental Sustainability

Sunrise Credit Union continues transitioning from fluorescent to LED lights throughout our branches. LED lights are energy-efficient, have a longer lifespan, are sturdier, and recyclable. They generate almost no warmth, are cool to the touch, and can be left on for hours without incident or consequence if touched. LEDs reduce the potential for safety dangers, such as burns and fires.

Sunrise Credit Union's IT Department strives to recycle electronic products in an environmentally friendly way through the Electronic Recycling Association (ERA) and the City of Brandon's e-waste recovery program. The ERA's Winnipeg office last performed a pickup of unwanted electronic items in March of 2023, with 15 total computers, eight printers, six money counters, six battery backups and several other various forms of equipment recycled during this pickup. We anticipate another pickup to occur before the end of the current calendar year.

Sunrise Out and About

Sunrise Credit Union's HR team attended the Brandon Career Symposium on April 23-24. The free event attracts high school students from across Western Manitoba, newcomers looking for work and those looking for a career change. In addition, they attended the EngAGed Career Fair by Agriculture in the Classroom Manitoba at Crocus Plains High School in Brandon on May 31.



The Holland staff members had a blast at the Holland Ag Society's Family Fun Day on June 2. Sunrise Credit Union brought the fun with Connect 4 and Giant Jenga games for the kids to enjoy.



The Baldur branch staff demonstrated their community spirit on the evening of June 5 by planting flowers for the Baldur Flower Committee, a heartwarming initiative that reflects Sunrise Credit Union's commitment to community involvement.

Members participated in many things, from equine or cattle clinics to nail/string art, photography, tie-dye, science in the kitchen, woodworking, archery, small animals, judging clinics and much more.



Sunrise Credit Union was the largest individual sponsor for the Manitoba 55+ Games in Brandon from June 18-20. More than 900 people participated in various events and activities. Sunrise was prominent at the Appreciation Banquet, Opening Ceremonies and in making medal presentations at several events. Sunrise's sponsorship was in addition to the systemwide support for the event.

Sunrise Credit Union's generous donation of \$5,000 to the Westman Volt Hockey program for the purchase of a second set of jerseys for their national competition in mid-May is a testament to our commitment to inclusivity. VOLT Hockey, an inclusive sports program in Brandon, provides an exciting opportunity for individuals with disabilities to participate in a fun team sport. The indoor games take place in a safe environment with dedicated volunteers, where players utilize electric scooters for enhanced mobility and an exhilarating playing experience. Our collective effort raised a total of \$115,083 in Brandon, a significant contribution to these worthy causes.

The Melita branch staff donated \$1,320.00 to the Royal Canadian Legion Branch No.127 to help purchase new chairs. The Legion in Melita is thriving with several meat draws, Chase the Ace, league darts and dart tournaments, and fundraising suppers throughout the year.
